

## **Lesson Plan - Earth Protectors** Lessons from a Landfill - Kindergarten/4th Grade

- Students will gain knowledge of how a landfill is built and filled to protect the earth, water, air, people and animals.
- Students will understand where their trash goes and how it gets there.
- Students will be encouraged to be earth protectors by learning to reduce, reuse and recycle

## **Vocabulary Words:**

Solid Waste: All things that we no longer need or want.

Reduce: To make smaller.

**Reuse:** To use again, in another, new or different way.

**Recycle:** To melt and reshape an item into a new item.

Landfill: Specially built disposal area for trash.

Landfill Operator: Staff who works at the landfill to help unload, bury and smash the trash.

Working Face: Area of the landfill where gaarbage trucks unload trash

and landfill operators move the trash.

Leachate: liquid made from rain and snow flowing over the trash.

### **Discussion:**

Ask students how their family disposes of their trash

- burn
- curbside collection
- Brainstorm ways to make less trash

• reusable plates, cups, bottles, lunch boxes, cloth napkins and cloth towels, wooden pencils Discuss with students if they have been to the landfill or local Transfer Station with their parents. What was their experience like?
